**Presbyterian Children's Village Receives
TD Bank Charitable Foundation Grant**
Funds Support After School/Summer Programs for At-Risk Children

(Rosemont, PA) The Presbyterian Children's Village has received a \$2,500 grant from the TD Bank Charitable Foundation (Portland, ME) for its After School/Summer Program in Prevention Services. The Village relies on the support of many private donors to fund After School/Summer Program costs not covered by public funding.

The Village's After School/Summer Program provides a safe, supervised, and structured program focused on academic, recreational, and enrichment activities. The goals of the Program are to provide academic enrichment activities including support to improve the student's reading and math skills, to provide social skills and personal growth development opportunities for participants, to encourage parental involvement, and to link with community partners to meet the recreational, health, and social service needs of children and families thereby strengthening the Southwest Philadelphia neighborhood served by the Program.

Founded as an orphanage in 1877, Presbyterian Children's Village today is a non-profit corporation dedicated to the healing of the spirits of children, families and communities broken by violence, addiction, poverty, mental illness, racism and other serious societal problems. The Village serves more than 7,000 children each year in the greater Philadelphia area.
